Watch out for your water pressure; most manufacturers recommend nothing more than 40-50 lbs of pressure on PV modules. Any more can cause microfractures and/or damage the joints in the panel frame. Ideally, though, you want water with a TDS of 0-30ppm for cleaning your solar panels.
